

Bachelor of Science in Accountancy

In order for a country to develop, it is necessary to create a pool of trained personnel in the various fields of national economy. The right direction had been taken in other fields such as medicine, engineering, Diploma in Accountancy, among others. It is also a natural corollary that professions of accounting should follow suit. Based on this fact the Bachelor of Science in Accountancy was introduced at The Technical University of Kenya in the year 2010. It is worth to note that this is the first time in the Republic of Kenya a Bachelors degree course in Accountancy is being offered in a public University.

Entry Requirements

Applicants shall be eligible for admission into the Bachelor of Accountancy degree in the School of Business and Management Studies in the following categories:

KCSE Candidates

The basic admissions requirement shall be the minimum entry requirements set for entry into the public universities, which is at least a mean grade of C+ in the Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE). In addition, candidates are expected to have performed well in the following cluster of subjects in KCSE examinations, but at any rate shall have obtained at least a grade C+ in each of the cluster subjects:

Cluster Subjects

- English/Kiswahili
- Mathematics A or Any Group II
- Any group III
- Any group II / 2nd Group III / Any Group IV/ Any Group V

KCSE Subject Grouping

- Group I: English, Kiswahili, Mathematics
- Group II: Biology, Physics, Chemistry
- Group III: History and Government, Geography, Christian Religious Education, Islamic Religious Education,
- Hindu Religious Education
- Group IV: Home Science, Art and Design, Agriculture, Aviation Technology, Computer Studies
- Group V: French, German, Arabic, Music, Business Studies

A-Levels or Equivalent

- Applicants should have a minimum of two (2) principal passes and a subsidiary pass in the General Paper at A-level and have passed with a credit in English at O-levels.

Higher Diploma (HDip) in Business Management or Equivalent

- Applicants with a Higher Diploma (HDip) in Management offered by The Technical University of Kenya or any other recognized examining body.

Diploma in Business Management or Equivalent

- Holders of a Diploma in Accountancy and Business Administration of The Technical University of Kenya or an equivalent qualification from a recognized examining body.

CPA/CPS Part II or Equivalent

- Holders of CPA/CPS Part II or equivalent qualification.
